Filming Notes

- Make sure that every single associate and resident on camera is wearing a
 mask. The VLD can remove their mask to do the opening and closing
 messages if they are the only person in the frame.
- Our team recommends using a tripod or handheld stabilizer to film your video to limit any shaking from people's hands.
- Add soft, instrumental music behind the video to help keep the video moving.
- Make this video your own! Make sure to add a feel of your Solstice Senior Living community to your video!
